So if you're there wondering whether I am merely attempting to reinvent the wheel with empty claims about "new truths", that's ok. Skepticism is not always a bad thing. After all, there are so many different views on the internet you don't know what to believe and who's telling the truth.

However, before you set off your "false prophet" alarm bells and raise your "charlatan" red flags it is very important that you read this entire document – all the way to the very end – because what I am going to share with you is quite simple. I am not here to impress you with stories about some "mystical" encounter with all the bells and whistles of an Ezekiel vision, neither am I seeking an opportunity to stuff my religious views down your throat (there is no need for that).

Nevertheless, I trust you are a honest seeker after truth who is willing to travel the road that religious bigots and ignoramuses are not prepared to tread. And the mere fact that you have chosen to download this PDF file to your computer (or mobile device) is positive indication you are at least open to biblical perspectives other than what you have already heard.

What I'm going to reveal to you is about an extraordinary experience pertaining to how my knowledge of the prophecies was transformed

almost overnight and I'm sure you will at least identify with what I'm going to say when you hear the whole story.

In fact, it is not so much about a particular doctrine as it is about a particular principle ... a principle of which just about every prophecy student is very much aware but seems to forget completely! Yet, this is largely what makes this end-time discovery such an intriguing breakthrough.

There was a time in my experience as a Bible student when I thought I have heard it all and known just about everything there is to be known about last day events. But just when I thought I could have given myself the pat on the shoulder for my more than twenty years of experience in prophecy studies I was suddenly awaken to the shocking reality that the <u>real</u> prophecy study has just begun!

It was since I decided to take a more dispassionate and open-minded approach to studying the word of God I came to realize that, despite all my years of experience studying last-day events, I still have quite a bit to learn (and unlearn) where the prophecies of Daniel and Revelation is concerned. And to tell you the truth, what I've discovered in my latest research is so frightening I wish I could tell you it will not be so!

And while the things I'm now discovering has been a genuine cause for concern, the real concern is not so much about the many adversities that are going to take place on planet earth ... not so much about how the enemies of Christ and His truth will one day commandeer the world. My greatest fear is about how ill-prepared we are for them!

It is all good and well for us to sit comfortably in group discussions and talk glibly about what is coming upon the earth, but are we **spiritually** and **intellectually** prepared to face the coming crisis?

Over my more than two decades of prophecy studies, my main concern has always been about the lack of understanding and coherency that is exhibited by the vast majority of Christians in relation to the knowledge of Bible prophecy.

I am so amazed at the level of ignorance and indifference among so-called Bible-believing churches that I am tempted to wonder whether there is not a conspiracy afoot to bring about this state of things. And as if that is not bad enough, the very book of the Bible we are admonished to read and understand (Rev. 1:3) – the book of **REVELATION** – is often shrouded in mystery and abused by theological gymnastics and intellectual dishonesty.

The common trend in almost every prophecy discussion I take part in is that while everybody wants to have his/her own point of view, nobody wants to <u>follow Bible instructions</u>.

And the result – controversy, confusion, and factional divisions.

And while all of this is going on many are being "tossed to and fro and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive" (Eph. 4:14).

This could never be how Lord designed it! This is the kind of situation the apostle Paul had to address in his day when he cautioned the brethren at Corinth that "**God is not the author of confusion**, but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints." 1Cor. 14:33.

It is very sad to see the world advancing in scientific knowledge, creating inventions such as we've never dreamed could exist (Dan. 12:4), while the Christians seem to be backward in their thinking! Is it any wonder that Jesus declared that "the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of light!?" Luke 16:8

In my most recent prophecy research one of the amazing things I've found is that the end-time prophecies of the Bible are <u>far easier</u> to understand than many of us are making it out to be! When I came to this realization, I immediately began to see why so many of us are finding it so hard to wrap our heads around some simple things not just in Bible prophecy but the Bible in general!

One of the major problems in our prophecy studies is that most of us are taught to give meanings to things we have no biblical instruction to interpret. In other words, instead of allowing the scriptures to provide its own solutions, we spend all our time conjuring up interpretations for everything including the "forbidden fruit" that Eve ate!

I'm ashamed to say this but when I came face to face with the awareness that God has deliberately designed end-time prophecy to be so easy for the common man to grasp, I began to see how much of a fool I was making of myself imbibing fallacious ideas about how Bible prophecy is to be interpreted!

If the truth be told, as Bible students, we all want to know more about the Bible. All of us are searching the scriptures to understand the truth. All of us have difficulties in understanding some Bible passage. And we all make mistakes in our interpretations time and time again!

It's just a part of the process of developing a better grasp of the word. But to what extent are we progressing in our understanding of the scriptures? And to what extent is our knowledge of prophecy preparing us for the end of the world?

We have come to a time in earth's history when we can ill afford to be ignorant and uncertain about what the scriptures are saying about the future of planet earth. And the only way to be certain about what we believe is to **STUDY THE BIBLE FOR OURSELVES.**

It is for this reason that I wish to share with you a personal testimony of what the Lord has actually revealed to me in His word concerning the final crisis predicted in the Book of Daniel and Revelation, and how it resulted in the formulation of an end-time prophecy course.

Ok, I know you are itching to get the **Seven Steps to Becoming a Prophecy Expert in 48 Hours**. Just bear with me. I am sure you will get a better appreciation of these 7 principles when you read my story in the next topic.

IF THIS IS NOT A REVELATION FROM GOD I DON'T KNOW WHAT IS

In all my 25+ years of prophecy studies, I have never been so convicted of Bible truth the way I am today. The Lord had shown me many truths from the Bible, but I must confess my most recent understanding of last-day events is based on the surest revelation I have ever received.

Yes! It was indeed a revelation!

While I do not make any pious claims to have received any visions from God, there was something significant about how my whole perspective on Bible prophecy has changed that up to this very day I cannot understand. What I can be certain about, however, is how this new position on end-time prophecy <u>did not</u> come about:

- It did not come as a result of listening to an afternoon sermon
- I did not get it from reading a book
- It wasn't the result of listening to some big name prophecy expert on TBN or 3ABN
- Neither was it the result of an inspiring one-to-one Bible discussion with a brother or a sister – nothing of the sort!

And those are the usual ways in which I received new truths. But this particular experience was remarkably different.

Here is how it happened

It was on a rainy Sabbath day, it was raining for most of the day, on and off. I turned up at church in the early part of the afternoon. Being a small fellowship, it was only a few of us that showed up that day; three of us to be exact (apparently, a full turnout was dampen by the inclement weather). Anyway, at about 4:00pm we started an informal Bible study on Revelation 13. And as usual different schools of thought were expressed, and we all listened to each other (the good thing about our little fellowship is that you can freely express what is on your mind [wrong or right] without being accused of heresy or viewed with suspicion).

To tell you the truth, this discussion is not one of those conversations in which I can say we were in perfect agreement, but there was something about the discourse that causes me to think ... and think hard. In the middle of the discussion, I was burdened with something on my mind, but I just could not put a finger on it.

I can remember at one stage when we were arguing on a verse in Revelation 17, I was trying to make a point and it just would not come out the way I thought it should. That's when I knew there was something of great significance for me to investigate.

It was as if God was quietly at work trying to find a ready outlet to reveal something of tremendous importance, but I did not know what it was! And it did rest on my mind until I reached home.

That's the time I got a chance to be alone, away from the noise of a back-and-forth discussion, and the prodding discourses. It was at that point that I decided to take my Bible along with my Strong's Concordance in preparation for what I suspect would be a marathon prophecy study. And quite a marathon it was! Believe me, I didn't know what I was really about. I didn't have a clear idea what I was

searching for. All I knew was that I was prompted by a Sabbathafternoon Bible study on the book of Revelation.

I was even supposed to visit a friend that night, but I could not, because I was determined that whatever it is that was causing this "anxiety" I need to find out. So I began by reading through Revelation 13 to try and get the sense of the narrative. In reading that chapter, I tried to be as honest and dispassionate as I can. And, yes, I kind of grasp what the passage is saying, but the big question that stood out in my mind was...

...Who is this beast with seven heads and ten horns?

So I went over into chapter 17, where this same beast is spoken of. I can't remember if I actually read through the whole of that chapter, but as I was reading through the verses – lo and behold – I came upon a very important verse that led to the solution to not only the two chapters under consideration, but to end-time prophecy for the most part!

Immediately after I read this verse, I felt as if a 500-watt light bulb switched on in my head. The clear Bible instruction in this particular verse proves to be the 'game changer' that precipitated my new outlook on Bible prophecy.

The verse I am talking about is none other than Revelation 17:11. Here is what it says,

"And the beast that was, and is not, even he is the eighth, and is of the seven, and goeth into perdition"

Having read through verses 9 and 10, which clearly teach that the **seven heads** on the beast are **seven kings**, I immediately realized that what this verse is actually telling me is that...

...the beast = the eighth king!



Yes, that same beast that John saw (verse 3), that will ascend from the bottomless pit (verse 8), is actually an eighth king!! (Go and read it for yourself!) When I realized what this text is really saying, and the treasure of truths it opens up, I immediately pounded the wall with the palm of my hand in elation, constantly thanking God and shouting, "Sure word of prophecy!!!" (If you were there and saw how I went on, you would perhaps want to throw a net over me and cart me off to the appropriate institution).

For me, this is undoubtedly a revelation from Jehovah Himself! I never before had reason for thanking God the way I thanked Him then. And you may be wondering why I had to be beside myself like this over such a simple Bible text! Here's why. It is not so much what the text says that strikes me, but **where it leads**.

It goes to show that when you accept a particular interpretation of scripture it is not so much your impression of what it says that will help you determine its validity, but where it takes you when reasoned to logical conclusion. No doctrine must be treated as a separate chain link. All Bible tenets, including the prophecies, are interconnected in a perfect chain of doctrinal principles.

This very discovery has toppled the stronghold of long held misconceptions, which was the source of my confusion concerning some of the most basic prophetic concepts. It also helps me to see why some of what I used to believe concerning Daniel and Revelation were so difficult to explain from the Bible. And the interesting thing about how I made this discovery is not because my research deserves the Nobel Peace Prize or because I'm some kind of luminary with a theological degree because, frankly, I have none!

You are going to be surprised when you find out how I came to understand biblical predictions the way I understand it today. In fact, it is something most of us already know but are too blind-sighted by popular teachings to accept as having any significant bearing on their prophecy studies.

Remember I told you, it is not about doctrine, it's about a principle we're all familiar with? Now, read carefully, I am now going to tell you what this principle is. Here we go:

The one principle that makes it possible for me to rejoice in my new found knowledge of Bible prophecy today is nothing but the **implicit**

in the scriptures.

Did you get that!? If you don't, let me repeat.

Understanding Bible prophecy is less about theological analysis and more about following clear Bible instructions down to the last iota.

If that sounds too simple to you, then that's precisely how simple endtime prophecy study can be! I guess it's the simplicity of this principle that is throwing most of us off track because we somehow believe that if prophecy is that simple then everybody would be able to explain it! But isn't that the very reason why God gave us the prophecies!? That we all should understand it for ourselves!? Have you ever wondered what difference it would have made had every single Jew understood the prophecies surrounding Jesus' first advent!? Certainly, they wouldn't have instigated His crucifixion!

Have you ever asked yourself how did Abraham and Sarah misinterpreted a clear promise from God, predicting they will have a son in their old age? The fact is, Abraham and his wife reinterpreted the prophecy to suggest that God did not really mean it that way; that what He really meant was this child will be provided through Hagar, Sarah's handmaid, because Sarah was too old to have children. But they were proven to be so wrong!

Abraham's attempt to fulfill God's promise through Hagar, the bondwoman, only created needless tension in his family which forced him to take the hard decision to cast out the bondwoman with her son (Gen. 21:10; Gal. 4:30).

Like Father Abraham, many of us are trying to solve Bible prophecy, not by accepting God's precise instructions, but by what seems reasonable to human minds! (Have you heard about the "meaning" of the forbidden fruit that Eve ate in the Garden of Eden? According to speculators it's not literal any more!) Thus, the inclination to put a spin on what God predicted in His word is ingrained in the human nature.

ARE WE ALL BLIND OR WHAT!!?

I was absolutely amazed to find out that the main reason why the dark clouds of **confusion**, **uncertainty**, and **controversy** loom around the subject of prophecy is because **we are not** <u>really</u> **following Bible instructions regarding prophecy interpretations.** Believe it or not, the problem is as simple as that! If you do this prophecy e-course, you will see for yourself the value of what I am talking about. It made me wonder how is it that we can be so blind! And when I consider my own inadequacy, I shuddered to even think the Lord could use me to help others understand Bible prophecy.

I am saying this because if you should get the chance of listening to me making a Bible presentation, you would realize that I am not the best presenter there is; I am neither eloquent nor charismatic. Among the bretheren that I fellowship with there are some of the most competent Bible expositors whom I consider to be far more capable than I am of taking up this task. So I was quite surprised that the Lord has chosen the less competent person to give this revelation to (could it be that my keen observation of the prophetic word over those 25 years, and my willingness to embrace new truths were preparing me for this day?).

I can remember that during the first of those 25 years of prophecy studies, I wasn't even baptized yet! In fact, my extraordinary interest in the prophecies is the very reason why I am a Christian today (I never believed that I could have ever stopped going to the racehorse betting shops on Saturdays)! And would you believe that I was first introduced to the prophecies by a friend who, at the time, was a former Christian? I was so interested in what he was saying that the conversation, which started from earlier in the night, went right up until about midnight! From that day forward I decided to take end time Bible prophecy seriously, and there I began my journey of prophecy studies. And as providence would have it, my friend was motivated to recommit his life to Christ. **Praise God!!!**

Then to prove that this was indeed a revelation from God, when I decided to use the Berean rule (Act. 17:11) and reasoned this conclusion from the verse to its logical end, a whole host of truths from Revelation chapters 12-22 began to jump out at me! I had to get around the computer almost in a panic, and started typing out a rough list of new truths I discovered. I was so afraid that if I should sit on my laurels and neglect to do this, these precious truths would leave my mind – never more to return!

Through this new discovery, Revelation 13 comes alive in no uncertain terms, and I was beginning to get a better sense of what is <u>really</u> the Devil's agenda for the last days, and what is God's strategy to counter him.

And as if that wasn't enough, as I continue to pursue this line of prophecy study in the weeks and months that follow, using the <u>biblical interpretation</u> in Revelation 17:11 as the major premise, I was shocked to realize that the logical conclusion to which it leads not only corresponds with the prophecies of Daniel, but it fits <u>neatly</u> into the latter-day prophecies of Isaiah, Jeremiah, and almost all the minor prophets! **Incredible!!** (By my count, it was about 13 prophets in all!)

I needed nothing more to tell me that what I have concluded from this study on Revelation 17:11 is, indeed, a **nail in a sure place**!

A cluster of Bible truths in just one verse!!?

I can now see that over the years I was actually taking this particular verse for granted, assuming that the way I was taught to interpret it was correct. I guess I was too steeped in the "mainstream" mindset

that it blinded me to the truth for so many years until that very Saturday night. And for this experience I say, More power, honour, and glory to the Almighty, whose name alone is Jehovah, the only Potentate King of kings and Lord of lords, and to the only wise God, forever!! For only the power of Omnipotence could have revealed a cluster of hidden truths in just one single verse!

This experience was so overwhelming it was as if the Lord had taken me on His *Divine Website* and told me to *click on a link*. And when I did, page after page of prophecy truths began to open up before me! And, would you believe it, this prophecy course that I am going to tell you about later is based on this one revelation! Those 25 years of prophecy studies now appear to be of minor significance compared to what the Lord has revealed to me in one night. My whole thinking on end-time prophecy was completely overhauled!

Now, I'm sure you would want to know what is this "new truth" that makes me so concerned about the future of planet earth. Go to the next topic and you will find out.

THE GREAT PROPHECY TRUTH THAT ALMOST NO ONE IS TALKING ABOUT

There are many truths that were revealed to me since that time, but I'm going to tell you about the major revelation. If you are the kind of person who is aligned to the mainstream position on Bible prophecy, you are going to find what I am about to tell you to be something unheard of. And I guarantee this is not something you have ever been taught in any prophecy class whatsoever! Yet it is the most conclusive revelation I have ever received since the day I started studying Bible prophecy!

Let me tell you a little bit about how I arrive at my conclusions from the prophetic word. First of all, I do not believe that God intends to make prophecy study such a complicated thing to the point where you have to consult a lettered theologian in order to understand it. Endtime Bible prophecy is too critical a subject for a wise God to allow it to be mired in the muddy waters of controversy and confusion.

When I'm studying the word of God, I try to be as honest as I humanly can. I try as best as possible to remove all prejudices whether it be personal or denominational. I would also pray for courage to accept the truth whenever I see it and wherever found, no matter how contrary it is to my most cherished opinion.

I find that since I adopted this attitude the Lord was able to reveal many truths to my mind that would have been rejected had my mindset been otherwise inclined. And let me tell you something that many of us don't seem to realize. The Lord cannot work with a person

who does not have an open mind. Religious narrow-mindedness is nothing but a prescription for long term ignorance, even while you think you know so much.

Now, here is the truth I believe the Lord has revealed to me. I warn you, brace yourself because this could sound pretty outlandish depending on how you look at it.

From my honest and impartial study of end-time Bible prophecy I have no choice but to conclude that in the not-too-distant future **the world will be transformed into a new religious culture of outright idolatry and devil worship!** And, amazingly, this new world order will be actively promoted by the most influential in the society!

I want you to notice I did not merely say "a religious culture of idolatry" for you to think that I might be talking about the worship of money and cars etc, which are the milder forms of idolatry, but you will recognize my use of the word "outright".

Therefore, what I'm really suggesting is that the world will actually become a flat out heathen, devil-worshipping society just like the Canaanites, the Philistines, the Amorites, and all the other heathen nations. And the reason world will become such a cesspool for the proliferation of this kind of worship is because its inhabitants will, firstly, be deceived, then socialized and educated into the practice through a massive propaganda blitz!

Can you believe that!?

If you think it weird and practically impossible for a civilized and spiritually enlightened society to be suddenly convinced to go back to the dark ages of idol worship, frankly, I don't blame you. In fact, I considered this thing so unthinkable that even when I saw the evidence staring me in the face I was almost in denial. And so I decided to do a further search of the scriptures only to unearth more evidences of this dramatic shift in religious culture!

By that time I was already convinced <u>beyond a shadow of a doubt</u> that as the end of the world draws near, the inhabitants of planet earth will descend into the worst religious crisis the world has ever seen!

And by the way, this controversial discovery was made as a **direct result** of applying those seven steps in prophecy study I am about to share with you. I know you are chomping at the bit to see what this is about so I won't keep you any longer. See you in the next topic.

THE SEVEN STEPS IN PROPHECY STUDY THAT WILL MAKE YOU AN ADVANCED PROPHECY STUDENT IN NO TIME

What I am going to share with you are seven immovable principles that will catapult you to expert status as a prophecy student within a very short time. These are concepts that I recognize in my experience both as a veteran Bible student and more so since the new revelation.

In fact, I am quite sure you will instinctively consider most, if not all, of these seven steps to be self-evident and agreeable. You will notice I have included some article and video links to assist you with further research. I am not trying to reinvent the wheel or introduce anything you are not already familiar with; I am merely introducing a more simplified, common-sense approach to end-time prophecy studies.

Here we go:

STEP #1

Do not attempt to apply your own interpretations to symbolic prophecies; the Bible must be its own interpreter.

Have you ever been in a prophecy discussion (formal or informal) and find that every effort to come into harmony on a particular subject only results in endless controversy and sometimes confusion? The reason for this is because most prophecy students are programmed to discuss the Bible like defense lawyers in a murder trial instead of like jurors. In other words, they are merely taking positions and defending them to the death, instead of examining the simple facts in order to arrive at an impartial conclusion. In a discussion (or debate) like this you will notice one thing – either one or both sides of the controversy are not following Bible instructions in the interpretation of prophecy as they should. Yes, it is as simple as that!

The problem with some "prophecy experts" today is that they tend to treat the subject of prophecy as if the Lord has given them a monopoly on the interpretation of Daniel and Revelation. But when you examine their assorted positions you would find that they are nothing but a raft of conjectured theories and private interpretations. And their #1 problem? They are trying to interpret the prophecy instead of allowing the scriptures themselves to provide their own interpretations. In fact, THE ONLY WAY TO <u>ACCURATELY</u> INTERPRET SYMBOLIC PROPHECIES IS **NOT TO INTERPRET THEM AT ALL**. It's just not within our ability to solve.

If you want to test any argument on Bible prophecy, take this advice:

- If the logic of the argument is not according to <u>clear</u> Bible instructions
- If there is no way in which you can confirm it by a textual weight of evidence when compared to other related prophecies
- If when reasoned to logical conclusion it does not harmonize with the testimonies of different Bible writers
- If in order to make sense of it you have to consult a theologian and not the scriptures, and/or
- If it conflicts with the overall message of the Bible and makes God appears to be what He is not, YOU SHOULD NOT ACCEPT IT

These are the theological pitfalls you're most likely to encounter when you refuse to follow Bible instructions in how to interpret Bible prophecies.

I don't know about you, but in many prophecy discussions I have participated in, especially over the last ten or so years, very often I would hear words like, "I don't see it that way" or "That is not my opinion", as if we are in some political discussion where there are no absolutes! And you hardly hear anybody say, "Let us search to find out what is the Bible's stated solution to this problem". If we do not approach the study of the prophetic word with mindset of a humble seeker after truth we are just playing with opinions and wasting our time!

The reason why we have discussions like these is because people are simply ignoring the power of the interpretive tools the Lord has

provided in His word; many are so caught up in a desire to come up with an "original thought" that they take for granted the simple instructions in how to interpret Bible prophecies.

From my discussion with different prophecy students I have identified two major problems in how we analyze end-time prophecies:

- 1. We tend to give interpretations to prophecy symbols contrary to precise instructions, and
- 2. We choose to treat elements in Bible prophecy as symbols where they are intended to be taken literally.

Did you know that for every difficult prophecy there is a biblical solution? The interpretation of prophecy is not within the domain of humanity; the Bible and the Bible only is its own interpreter. If we refuse to make it a habit to **ask for the biblical solution,** we will inevitably be left to grope in the wilderness of our own opinions on Bible prophecy.

In emphasizing the importance of Divine revelation, Joseph, in his conversation with his two fellow prison inmates, asked the following rhetorical question: "Do not interpretation belong to God?" Gen. 40:8

And Peter in his second epistle states that "no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation" (2Pet. 1:20). The correct interpretation of prophecy is not exclusive to a particular denomination. Neither is it reposed in the possessors of theological degrees.

If you have any difficulty in understanding the prophecies, take the Bible's admonition and "ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally and upbraideth not" (James 1:5). The next time you seek to clarify the more difficult Bible prophecies, do not attempt to brainstorm; prayerfully search for the solutions either in the same passage where the prophecy is given or in other related scripture passages.

HOW SYMBOLIC PROPHECIES ARE INTERPRETED

The most noticeable factor in symbolic prophecies is they provide specific instructions regarding how the symbols are to be interpreted. The interpretive instructions given for each of these prophecies are not only for the benefit of the prophet in vision but also for the prophecy

students who need to understand the message the prophet conveys. Here are a few examples of prophecy interpretations:

THE DRAGON - That old serpent called **the devil** and **Satan** (Rev. 12:9; 20:2)

THE GREAT WHORE - That great city that reigns over the kings of the earth. Rev. 17:18

THE RAM WITH TWO HORNS - The kings of Media and Persia (Medes and Persians) Dan. 8:20

THE ROUGH HE GOAT - The king of Grecia (Greece) Dan. 8:21

GRADE 5 NOTES FROM THE PRIMARY SCHOOL OF BIBLE PROPHECY

When you are reading symbolic prophecies take everything literal as you go along – don't try to interpret anything (you don't have the answer anyway). As you continue to read, the Bible will interpret everything you thought was literal. Then you will find out what you were taking for its obvious meaning is really a symbol of something else. As you go along write down every solution to every symbol. Then go over the same passage and substitute each symbol for the solution. (To be continued...)

STEP #2

Do not try to interpret that which the Bible does not interpret

The usage of symbols in Bible prophecy is quite frequent. The symbolic prophecies are found in Daniel 2, 7, and 8 and in Revelation 12, 13, and 17. The understanding of what these symbols mean is the key to understanding the prophecies. The Bible must be allowed to explain the meaning of each symbol. We've seen that clearly in the previous step.

However, just as it is important to know what is treated as a symbol for interpretation, it is also important to know what the Bible <u>does not</u> treat as a symbol to be interpreted.

There are elements in some symbolic prophecies that the Bible does not interpret. Here is an example of what I am talking about. Concerning the symbols in Rev. 13, while we know that the Bible gives

a meaning for the leopard-like beast, the sea, the lamb-horned beast, and the dragon, it did not give a meaning for the earth from which the lamb-horned beast came up, the image of the beast, and the mark of the beast. Thus, they are not to be treated as symbols to be interpreted because the Bible does not give us any instruction as to what they are to be interpreted as.

If you examine Joseph's interpretation of Pharaoh's dream of the fatfleshed and leanfleshed cows you will see that while he gave a meaning for both sets of cows, he did not give an interpretation for the *river* from which they came, and the *meadows* they were feeding in, yet the prophecy was clearly understood by king Pharaoh (Read the whole story in Genesis 41). Where the Bible does not explain the meaning of a particular element in a prophecy either one of two things is the case:

- A. The Bible does not intend that this element be treated as a symbol and should therefore, be taken for its obvious meaning, or
- B. This element was placed in the vision as a mere prop of no symbolic significance. Usually an interpretation for this element is not critical to an understanding of the prophecy and must, therefore, be left alone. You cannot unlock something without the key to unlock it. If no key was provided, it simply means there is no need to unlock it.

We need to understand that the difference between a symbol and an interpretation is that while a symbol does not make anything clear, an interpretation does. A sure indication that a particular element does not require interpretation is the fact that in the scheme of the vision or Bible passage its literal application or lack of significance does not impede or obscure your understanding of the prophecy under consideration. No attempt must be made to interpret any element in a symbolic prophecy if the Bible itself does not supply the solution to that element. Such a practice would only amount to conjecture and outright speculation, and will therefore affect your overall conclusion.

BAD HABITS IN PROPHECY INTERPRETATION

Some prophecy students in their zeal to explain the prophetic word ended up providing interpretations for which the Bible does not give any instruction. In their assorted discourses you will hear them say, "Oh, the mark of the beast is not a literal mark", "the seal of God is

not a literal seal" in the same way others would say, "Oh, the fruit that Eve ate is not a literal fruit"!

These are bad habits in prophecy interpretation we need to avoid. It does not make biblical sense for one to insist that a particular element in a prophecy is not literal if we cannot find a shred of evidence that the Bible interprets them to mean otherwise. When it comes to prophecy study our duty is not to provide any interpretation but to <u>TAKE INSTRUCTIONS</u> in how the prophecies are to be interpreted.

GRADE 5 NOTES FROM THE PRIMARY SCHOOL OF BIBLE PROPHECY

(Continued from step 1)

Having determined what the meaning of each symbol is, as you go back through the passage you should then identify those elements that the Bible does not give a meaning for and write them down. You must also do a wider search of the scriptures (using a good concordance) to ensure that there is no solution to those elements.

When you look back at your list you will see elements for which the Bible gives a meaning, and elements you do not see a meaning beside. Those elements you do not see a meaning beside treat them for their obvious meaning or as a prop in the vision. You can try this at home, it's that simple.

STEP #3

Accept every biblical interpretation <u>precisely</u> as instructed in the scriptures – no paraphrasing or so-called "alternative rendering" should be applied.

Many Bible students would tell you that they know and acknowledge the biblical interpretations of prophecy; they are able to recite every Bible text where each solution to symbolic prophecy is found, but according to them they have a "problem". What's their problem? They need to paraphrase the interpretation or give it a "better rendering" to "reflect the truth".

Such has always been the practice of some high-horse theologians who love to beat you over the head with their knowledge of the Greek and Hebrew. And, yes, they have infected many church members with this spurious philosophy (I was a victim).

Jesus in his resistance of Satan's attempts to get Him to respond to his temptations, quoted Deuteronomy 8:3 saying, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God" (Luke 4:4). Every word of God carries weight, and is significant in conveying the message He desires to impart to our understanding.

It is very critical to our understanding of symbolic prophecies that we take every explanation provided in the scriptures as <u>precisely</u> the solution God intends to convey. Unless there's an issue with translation, any attempt to paraphrase or reinterpret will simply derail the consistency of the reasoning process by which you arrive at a Bible-based conclusion.

I have personally heard a lot of flawed arguments on prophecy as a direct result of attempting to give a "proper rendering" of a particular interpretation in the scripture. In fact, I was a proponent of this practice until I came around to the understanding that unraveling symbolic prophecies is all about following God's instructions exactly as He gives it to us in His word.

Whenever you are tempted to give a "proper rendering" of biblical interpretation remember Peter's admonition: "NO PROPHECY OF THE SCRIPTURE IS OF ANY <u>PRIVATE</u> INTERPRETATION" (2Pet. 1:20).

A SEEMINGLY HARMLESS BUT POTENTIALLY MISLEADING MANTRA IN PROPHECY INTERPRETATION

You are perhaps familiar with the popular phrase in certain theological circles, which goes like this: "A beast in prophecy is a kingdom or nation". This mantra stems from a misinterpretation of the four beasts in Daniel 7. Unfortunately, it is offered as a template as to how we should interpret the 'beast' symbols in other prophecies.

This can be misleading because it is actually suggesting that everywhere in symbolic prophecy a beast is mentioned it must be taken as the symbol of a nation. Hence, the following deduction from Daniel 7:

- 1. LION Babylon
- 2. BEAR Medo-Persia
- 3. LEOPARD Greece
- 4. TERRIBLE BEAST Rome

However that's not the precise instruction given to us as to how the prophecy must be interpreted. The clear interpretation of these four beasts is found in verse 17. Here is what it says: "These great beasts, which are four, are four kings..."

Thus, the four beasts are equivalent to four individual kings. That's Bible instruction. So, in effect, the above interpretation should be corrected to the read as follows:

- 1. LION King of Babylon
- 2. BEAR King of Medo-Persia
- 3. LEOPARD King of Greece
- 4. TERRIBLE BEAST King of Rome

If you examine other symbolic prophecies you will see that the idea of the beast being the symbol of a king is the consistent position. However, I do not recommend we use it as a template. Because every symbolic prophecy has its own set of interpretations, what I would advise you to do is to simply follow the interpretive instructions for each individual prophecy.

PROPHECY EXAM IS ABOUT TO BE IN SESSION

INVIGILATOR: Welcome to the final exam of prophecy interpretation. In this end-time prophecy exam you are required to find and copy your answers from the only source that has all the answers – the Bible. Your work will be marked according to how precise you copy your answers, and the validity of the passage you choose to copy your answers from.

Paraphrasing or alternative deductions, according to orthodox theological advice, may attract a self-imposed penalty and put you in danger of eternal exam failure for lack of knowledge (Hosea 4:6), unless you do a corrective resit. You may now begin.

STEP #4

Make sure your conclusions on two prophecies that are parallel do not contradict each other.

WHAT ARE PARALLEL PROPHECIES? Parallel prophecies are prophecies that speak of the same event or set of events over the same time period in similar and complementary details. E.g. Daniel 2 and 7 are parallel prophecies.

Treating parallel prophecies in isolation is one of the main reasons why discussions on Bible prophecies are often involved in so much confusion and uncertainty. This is because we refuse to coordinate prophecies according to sameness of events.

Many weird and fanciful theories are constructed as a result of not discerning the sameness of events or similarity of themes between the prophecies. Hence the practice of treating some of the parallel prophecies as if they are predicting separate events.

If your conclusions on each of the parallel prophecies are found to be contradictory in the least particular, you need to reexamine your position to see if you are ignoring corresponding details between the prophecies.

The natural result of coordinating the parallel prophecies is they present an overall picture of the same event or set of events where the availability of certain details in one prophecy complements the lack of such details in its parallel counterpart.

These prophecies, taken together, form an ambit into which you can even fit other prophecies that speak of the same event(s) in a limited way.

By this coordinating technique, it will make your prophetic analysis a breeze. Here's why. Because you are matching the sameness of events in those prophecies, you are forming an overall picture. Then having established what the overall picture is you can then fit into that picture other prophecies that relate to the events even in a partial way with additional details.

E.g.: The parallel prophecies of Daniel 2, 7, and 8 have painted an overall picture – the succession of world kingdoms leading up to the Second Coming of Christ. Despite the fact that Psalms 50 is limited in its application to those three chapters, it has some connection to the overall picture in that it also speaks of the Second Coming of Christ.

It is interesting to note that although Psalms 50 relates to the overall picture in a limited way, you will find that it supplies critical details on the Second Coming that are not found in the parallel prophecies of the book of Daniel.

You can use this same principle to throw light on Bible passages that are difficult to understand by comparing it with parallel Bible texts that are much simpler and easier to grasp. This will prevent you from having to brainstorm to figure out the answer to a difficult prophecy. In this way you will also be safeguarded from some of those popular but false beliefs, which result from a lack of scripture comparison.

THE DIFFICULTIES WE FACE WHEN WE REFUSE TO COORDINATE

The reason why so many of us are having difficulties solving certain prophecies is because we are treating one prophecy in isolation instead of coordinating it with other prophecies that make similar predictions.

For example, Revelation 13 and 17 are parallel prophecies in that they both speak of the beast with seven heads and ten horns. Yet some prophecy observers are trying to solve Revelation 13 in isolation from its parallel counterpart. You will often hear them haggling over a particular verse when all they need to do to solve their difficulties is examine corresponding information in the parallel prophecy.

I was making a presentation some time ago where I made the point that the first beast of Daniel 7 represents the rise of Nebuchadnezzar and I was raked over the coals for it despite the clear interpretation in the passage that the **four beasts are four kings**.

Of course their position is that the first beast represents the nation of Babylon. So in order to solve the problem I went over to the parallel prophecy of chapter 2 where the multi-metallic image is spoken of. In his interpretation of the different metals of the image before the king, the first thing that Daniel said to Nebuchadnezzar is "Thou art this head of gold." Dan. 2:38. Thus, in consistency with Daniel 7 the head of gold is clearly a representation of the reign of king Nebuchadnezzar.

THE PROPHECY MATHS CLASS

TEACHER: Students, today we will continue the lesson on the coordination of parallel lines of prophecies. Yesterday we looked at the most important formula, which is Daniel 2 parallel to Daniel 7 parallel to Daniel 8 is equal to....

CLASS: ...the succession of world kingdoms leading up to the Second Coming of Christ.

STEP #5

Do not <u>rely</u> on the opinions of even the most respected theologians.

The Bible admonishes us to try the spirits to see whether they be of God (1John. 4:1). Our understanding of the prophecies should not be founded on the basis of the utterances of theologians.

There is nothing wrong with listening to, or reading the writings of respected Bible commentators. But you must be like the Bereans in the book of Acts and search the scriptures to ensure that what you have been taught is in harmony with the scriptural truth (Acts 17:11).

You need to understand that its not all theologians out there are teaching the truth, and I will not presume to be an expert in differentiating a false preacher from a true one. All I am saying to you is, do not rely on the opinions of men for an understanding of prophecy.

If you are going be able to explain the prophecies to people in your witnessing activities, you must provide a scriptural basis for every thing you say, and not just a rehearsal or recitation of what you have learnt from a pastor, evangelist, or Bible commentator.

While every good Bible student will admit that they learn from attending Bible classes, reading books on prophecy, and listening to Bible commentators, they will also tell you that as a result of this exercise they learn to explain what they believe from the Bible and the Bible only. I encourage you to do the same.

Every good Bible teacher will so equip his students that they become well rounded and possess the ability to explain the scriptures for themselves. The purpose of attending Bible classes and reading books on Bible prophecy is to learn how to explain the prophecies from the perspective of the scriptures, and not be mere reflectors of the opinions of Bible instructors.

One of the benefits you will obviously gain from a sound understanding of the scriptures is the state of being safeguarded from the many unscriptural doctrines floating around in Christianity today.

It is to this end that the Bible admonishes us to "grow in grace, and in the <u>knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ</u>..." (2Pet. 3:18), "That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and

<u>carried about by every wind of doctrine</u>, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive" (Eph. 4:14).

BIBLE PROPHECY CLASS FOR LACKEYS

PROPHECY STUDENT: But Pastor, where is the Bible support for what you're saying?

MR. HIGH-HORSE THEOLOGIAN: No, no, no, no, no, no, you don't understand! It's not as simple as that! It's because you do not understand the Greek and the Hebrew why you're asking these silly questions! All you need to do is explain it exactly as I taught you! That's what all my students do!

PROPHECY STUDENT: But I want to be able to explain it from the Bible!

MR. HIGH-HORSE THEOLOGIAN: Oh come on, that's irrelevant. We are the interpreters of prophecies! Just tell your hearers you have been taught at the feet of a great theologian and they will believe you!

PROPHECY STUDENT: Pastor, I just want you to equip me to prove everything straight from the Bible. That's all.

MR. HIGH-HORSE THEOLOGIAN: This Bible class is for people who so revered my doctoral scholarship that they dare not question whether my teachings are biblical or not! How dare you!

STEP #6

Examine how fulfilled prophecies are interpreted in the Bible and be guided by the principles by which those prophecies are interpreted.

This principle is given a lot of lip service but in practice many are not really following the lessons from biblical interpretation of past prophecies. Nevertheless, this is a very powerful principle since it can be used as a guide into how you can interpret prophecies not yet fulfilled.

For me it is very surprising that in spite of the fact that the scriptures are so replete with such valuable illustrations of how prophecy is to be interpreted we are still in a state of uncertainty and confusion.

The Bible has not only given us the interpretation of yet-to-be-fulfilled prophecies, but it also leaves us in no doubt concerning the common principle at work by showing us how fulfilled prophecies were interpreted and how striking the harmony between the prophetic interpretation and the actual fulfillment (Read Genesis 40 and 41, and Daniel 4 for some great examples of how fulfilled prophecies were interpreted).

Unlike a Math teacher, who shows examples of how to find the answers then give you Math problems to solve on your own, the Lord shows us the examples, then gives us the problems with the answers all worked out, because we cannot solve it on our own! The reason why we need the examples of biblical interpretation from fulfilled prophecies is not so that we can use them as some kind of template to provide our own solution to other prophecies, but that we may use those examples as tools to ensure consistency of approach to prophecy study. These examples are also placed on record as a way of reassuring prophecy students that they are on the right track in their prophecy studies.

Some theologians will not accept this argument. They will perhaps tell you that it's too simplistic and not consistent with "scholarly analysis". But, in giving us the prophecies of Daniel and Revelation, the Lord did not intend – never intended – that we seek our solutions from any source outside the scriptures. Knowledge of last-day prophecies is too crucial for God to leave it up to the intellectuals in the church to interpret for us. That's the reason why He gives us all the interpretive tools in the Bible to ensure that we understand what He desires to impart to our minds.

WE ARE BLESSED WITH AN ABUNDANCE OF PROPHECY STUDY TOOLS IN THE BIBLE

It is amazing how the Lord has made prophecy study so hassle-free for us in so many ways. There are three items in the prophecy study tool kit that enable us to gain a better grasp of end-time predictions. They are as follows:

- 1. Specific instructions in the interpretation of prophecy symbols
- 2. The repetition of prophecies whereby we can compare scriptures with scriptures
- 3. A demonstration of how past prophecies were interpreted and how consistent they are with interpretations of prophecies not yet fulfilled.

A combination of these tools makes end-time prophecy study a breeze.

STEP #7

Beware of "orthodox" or "mainstream" positions on end-time prophecy.

It may appear as if I am bashing theologians but I am not. Theologians have played such a dominant role in setting up the standards by which modern Christianity is guided that you cannot remove them out of the picture in your support for and criticisms of church doctrines.

Attempting to criticize erroneous religious beliefs without rebuking those who are responsible for their formulation (the theologians) is like trying to criticize unfair government policies while believing that the politicians should not be held accountable!

As a Bible student seeking for truth as for a hidden treasure, one of your chief considerations should be that a teaching must not be accepted simply because it is widely taught by the most respected Bible commentators. In the many criticisms of unorthodox teachings by theologians you will often hear them say, "That's not mainstream."

This has been a growing trend among the clergy and it seems as if there is a push to unify the leaders of the various denominations in an attempt to unite all the churches under one orthodox position. The sure sign of a mainstream thinker is he is more concerned about what the majority decide rather than what the Bible teaches.

Did you know that one of the most orthodox teachings on prophecy in Christianity today is the doctrine of an "ever-burning hell"!? This is supposed to be the place where wicked people are to suffer throughout the ceaseless ages of eternity at the satisfaction of a God who swears by Himself saying, "As I live...I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked" (Ezek. 33:11)!!?

But if it's so true that the wicked will burn forever, why does the Bible teach that the wicked shall be burned to ashes (Malachi 4:1-3)? Will God be burning the ashes of the wicked throughout eternity? And why the Bible calls it the "second death" when they are supposed to be living eternally in torment!? (For further information on the subject of hell, see blog article)

That is how dangerous it can be to accept a teaching simply because it carries a preponderance of support from a wide cross section of

respected theologians who swears by its "truthfulness". But a lie is always a lie, and age, popularity, and closeness to the truth will not convert it to truth.

Your safest course is to make sure you diligently compare every teaching with what is noted in the scriptures of truth before you accept it. In other words, be like the Bereans in the book of Acts (Acts. 17:11) and make the Bible and the Bible only the standard by which all teachings are measured. Most importantly, BE HONEST WITH YOURSELF. It is difficult for the Lord to help anyone who is so mired in the paradigm of orthodoxy and mainstream thinking that they stifle their own consciences.

THE DOCTRINE OF THE IMMORTALITY OF THE SOUL IS ONE OF THE MOST ORTHODOX IN CHRISTENDOM... BUT ORTHODOX IS NO INDICATION OF TRUTH

One of the more prominent of mainstream doctrines in Christianity today is the doctrine of man's natural immortality. This is where people get the idea that after a man dies his soul lives on and either goes straight to heaven or straight to hell. This doctrine also forms the basis for the ever-burning hell theory. The belief that the soul of man cannot die inevitably leads to the conclusion that his punishment in hell will be unceasing in its duration.

However, the doctrine of the immortality of the soul as a root doctrine from which other doctrines are based is in serious doubt in light of clear scriptural declarations. In the book of Ezekiel it is plainly declared that "the soul that sinneth, it shall die." Ezek. 18:20.

In light of this text alone, it doesn't make sense insisting that after death the soul wanders around in a conscious state. Furthermore, Revelation 20:14 teaches that the final destruction of the wicked is called "the second death." If death is the cessation of life then on what basis can we justify the argument that unrepentant sinners will spend eternal life in misery? And by the way, where is the mercy in a God so infinitely cruel as to want to punish people throughout the ceaseless ages of eternity for just a short lifetime of sin!? Would you be happy to serve a God like that!? Wouldn't you rather a God who will put you out of your misery in the shortest of time?

Here is what they often do: they would hear of a developing story of a major event in the Middle East today, and by tomorrow morning they start to conjure up a Bible prophecy to match that event. And before you know it a video comes out telling us about how Daniel's prophecy is being fulfilled in the Middle East. In other words, it's all about forcing a prophecy to fit an event!

Beware of Satan's secret strategy

A lot of us who have taken an interest in the study of end-time prophecies are falling for Satan's secret strategy by which he's deceiving people who are not looking at the prophecies within the context of an overall framework. And you know what this strategy is? The manufacturing of what I would call 'dummy scenarios' to draw

attention away from the biblical scenario. Yes, Satan has the ability to engineer big events that look so much like the fulfillment of prophecies. However, The Lord has given us a prophecy framework by which we can know what point in earth's history we are at, and what next we are to expect.

This prophecy framework is the succession of world kingdoms leading up to the end of the world as predicted in the parallel prophecies in the book of Daniel. In this framework the kingdom of Rome is said to be the final world kingdom just before the Second Advent. Therefore, regardless of what is being fed to us from popular preachers, the antichrist of end-time prophecy will emerge from no other place beside the city of Rome.

What the enemy is trying to do is to use the media to feed us with major events in order to get us to ignore the overall picture in Bible prophecy and alter our perceptions of what is prophesied in scripture. When I was in my early to mid teens we used to call this strategy a 'hullu'.

When we want to prevent people from finding out the truth, we simply "sell them a hullu". When we want to get our mothers to not believe a complaint that is about to be made against us, we quickly "sell her a hullu". That's precisely what Satan is doing; he is selling us hullus after convincing hullus. And we are just eating them up hook, line, and sinker!

The purpose of hullus is simply to shift our focus from the truth, and right now Satan realizes he is in a sticky situation where all his end

time strategies are plainly exposed in the prophecies of Daniel and Revelation. Therefore, in order to get us to not have a clue about his plans for the last days, he will have to crowd us in with all sorts false scenarios, side issues, and lies to keep the truth away from us. And the result? Because you are so caught up in these false scenarios you are left exposed to the risk of being unaware of the real fulfillment when it occurs.

Anyway, let's get back to the prophecy e-course.

Prophecy e-course overview

I'm going to give you a brief outline of the major topics in the prophecy course that makes it stand out as an instructional material. And, of course, because the knowledge of truth is progressive, this prophecy study is subject to adjustments and regular updates. So, here we go:

An outline of the principles of biblical interpretation: - This is the part of the study that sets forth the basic principles by which this ecourse is guided. This 14-point study guide will enable you to handle many difficulties with different Bible texts, especially as they relate to the prophecies.

Coordinating the parallel prophecies in the book of Daniel: This is in the form of a chart which outlines the parallel prophecies of
Daniel 2, 7, 8, and 11. It seeks to coordinate the points of parallel by
means of arrow indications. This is accompanied by a companion
article entitled, Looking at the overall picture through the
parallel prophecies, which seeks to explain how you should use this
chart to guide you in your general prophecy studies. By the time you

are through with this topic you should have a general understanding concerning the fulfillment of Daniel's prophecies from the days of Nebuchadnezzar to the Second Advent.

A lesson in prophetic interpretation from Joseph:- This is a topic

that highlights Joseph's interpretation of the prophetic dreams of the chief baker and chief butler as well as the two dreams of Pharaoh, in the book of Genesis, by means of two simple illustrative charts. It points lessons we can learn, as well as some bad habits in prophecy interpretation that should avoid. It we also illustrates the kind of attitude we should adopt in our prophecy studies as we prepare for the end of the world.

Who is the beast with seven heads and ten horns: - This Q&A section seeks to identify who the beast is, and gives a coordination of Bible texts from Daniel, Revelation, and the epistles of apostles John and Paul. In this section, you will see the awesome power of scripture comparison, and by so doing, you will be able to arrive at the obvious conclusions without having to speculate about who the beast is, what the mark of the beast is, and precisely how the New World Order will be implemented.

The interpretation of symbols is a small section that seeks to establish the interpretations for all the major symbols used in the

prophecy under consideration. You will notice that I do not attempt to skew any of the interpretations to reflect a bias towards a particular viewpoint. I will give them to you just as they are stated in the Bible and without the ghost of a chance of being accused of theological gymnastics!

This little section is so valuable you can copy and print it out, and tuck it in your Bible for easy reference at your fingertips. When you have this, you don't need to get into a controversy with anyone over the meaning of a symbol in Daniel or in Revelation; just flash out your little "reference manual" and show them the <u>precise instructions</u> in the interpretation of prophecy symbols with all the Bible references to match!

Making important connections in Bible prophecy is more than just a topic; it's an entire section by itself which enlarges on the principle of scripture comparison of parallel prophecies and takes it to another level. In this section of the study you will know how to use the formula A=B=C, therefore, A=C to ensure that your conclusions stand on solid ground. By this method you will be able to use logical deductions and make *definite applications* simply by observing the existing solutions the Bible has provided.

Presented in the form of seven propositions, this is going to be the most controversial, mainly because of the definite applications of prophecy symbols. I will even quote from various authors to show why I arrive at some of the conclusions (actually, I have come to realize that some of the books on prophecy that I neglected to read, because of my former bias against them, are actually good research materials; they are not doctrinally perfect,

but they have nuggets of information that bears on the prophecy under consideration).

In this section, I will also introduce you to what is called the Equidistant Letter Sequence (ELS), or Bible codes, to establish, beyond a shadow of a doubt, what will be the real issue in the final crisis that almost no one is telling you about! If you read this section alone you will get a clear enough understanding of what is, essentially, the Devil's master plan for the last days ... and it will leave you gasping for breath when you find out who will be his chief partners in crime!

It provides extensive commentaries, which will help you understand what the Bible means by the beast receiving a deadly wound and why the world will wonder after him after his deadly wound was healed [almost every Bible commentator I read and listen to drop the ball on this one].

If you're an Adventist you would be interested to know what the course has to say about the subject of the *National Sunday Law*. The problem with how many are representing the issue is they make it appear to be a conflict over which day is the right day to worship God on. The Sunday issue is going to be far bigger than that!

On these pages you are going to see a 4-part pictorial illustration that fiercely drives home the point – beyond the shadow of a doubt – that the mark of the beast will, in fact, be issued via a **harmless religious exercise**! And just in case you will not be convinced by the 4-part illustration I have added a 5th on the very next page.

This final piece of evidence drives the final nail in the coffin of skepticism about what those pictures are obviously saying. The information conveyed in the illustrations alone will be so mind-blowing that after you have completed the entire course you will want go back over those pages again and again to make sure you're reading right! They are guaranteed to change the way you think about the whole issue surrounding the mark of the beast ... forever!

You will also find out why it can be misleading to teach that the mark of the beast will be "enforced" upon the world, and why we are barking up the wrong tree when we tell people to ...

"say no to that mark"

Right away I can tell you immediately disagree with me on this. But has it ever occurred to you that, as you are reading this info, the world is being thoroughly warned not to take this evil mark?

- You hear it in your church
- You hear it on the radio
- You watch it on TV
- You read about it on the internet
- You read about it in books
- Even the worldly-minded people are up in arms about it

- yet the Bible, which is not supposed to lie, teaches that all classes of people - including regular people like you and me - will eventually take the mark of the beast, as if they have never been warned!!

If you want to make sure you have your head in the right place on this mark-of-the-beast issue, just bear one thing in mind –

THE DEVIL IS NOT STUPID!!

Do you think Satan is going to sit idly by and allow the world to be enlightened about his end-time strategy if he expects it to ever work!? The fact is, the Devil is still up to his old bag of tricks, and he is ten times smarter than he was when he went into the Garden of Eden and sold Eve that subtle lie –

"Ye shall <u>not</u> surely die" Gen. 3:4.

I will demonstrate from this prophecy course what he is <u>now doing</u>, and what he <u>will do</u>, to ensure the accomplishment of his purposes as the end of the world approaches.

Let me let you in on a little secret that I found out since I got this new revelation. You may find it strange, but here it is:

Therefore, in the Devil's end-time game plan, **pushing the scheme** is more important than **pushing the mark.** Satan will so arrange matters that in order to be able to buy and sell you will have to become apart of his end-time religious scheme.

Here is a basic example of what I'm trying to say:

A credit union is offering special loan and mortgage benefits to employees of a particular company. In order to benefit from this special arrangement you are required to show your company ID. In other words, it is the company ID, or the lack thereof, that will determine whether or not you get this benefit. But in order to get this company ID you must first be employed by the company!

So, in effect, it is being an employee of the company that will determine your entitlement to those benefits. Therefore, when you become a part of this company you will gladly look forward to getting your company ID as soon as possible (without having to be forced to do so).

In the mark-of-the-beast scenario, just picture the New Religious Order as 'the company', and the beast's mark as 'the company ID'. And come to think of it, don't we teach that the seal of God and the mark of the beast operate on the same principle!!? Don't we teach that the mark of the beast is the counterfeit to the seal of God? Don't we teach that the mark of the beast operates in contradistinction to the seal of God? If that's what you believe, you are correct! But here's where it gets inconsistent:

If God will not force his seal on anyone, why do we teach that the mark of the beast will be forced on us? The truth is the mark of the beast, like the seal of God, is all about relationship and not so much about enforcement! Why would anyone with the intelligence of Satan think that he can win your soul by simply tying you down, for instance,

and print 666 in your forehead when, in truth and in fact, you have no relationship with him!? Get the logic?

In this entire section alone you will see Satan's battle plan for what it is, with all its devices and strategies. By the time you are through with this section you would be well on your way to becoming a 'ninja' prophecy student.

The fact is, whether you want to believe it or not, the Devil is carefully preparing the world to accept falsehoods about end-time events and a lot of who you see out there preaching about the mark of the beast are not telling you the truth! Could it be that they are part and parcel of a conspiracy to keep people in ignorance in order to ensure that the plan to get the world to embrace this new religious culture works!?

This state of affairs reminds me of a fictional story about a vampire stalker who goes around killing prostitutes and sucking their blood. A senior detective decided to investigate the spate of killings and issue public advisories.

This detective claims he was tracking this vampire stalker, yet several months have passed without a breakthrough, even while the killer was still on a rampage without the ghost of a chance of being caught! In the end, guess who the vampire stalker turned out to be.....the same detective who was investigating the murders! He was merely playing the role of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde all at the same time!

I think we have lot of Dr. Jekylls/Mr. Hydes in our pulpits posing as prophecy experts but in reality they are just there to 'set up smoke screens' and 'throw sand in our eyes'.

Under the topic *Grievous Wolves in Sheep Clothing*, you are going to witness before hand the mother of all betrayals when you read what the Bible has to say about the role of false preachers in the coming crisis.

A prophetic proclamation couples everything together by giving you an overall prediction from the rise of the beast to the Second Coming of Christ. It draws on all the biblical solutions that is available and makes a definite application as to exactly how the prophecy will be fulfilled.

It tells you what dramatic event will trigger the mark-of-the-beast crisis, how the New Religious Order will be set up, and about all the major players in this final conflict. In some cases instead of using the Bible words, I substitute them for definite descriptions of people, places, and things to which they obviously apply.

Take for example, in Revelation 17, the woman that sits on that seven-headed beast is the symbol of a popular Christian denomination that emerged in the sixth century as an imperial power, and will rise again in the last days with even greater authority.

In my subjective opinion, any body who claims to be a prophecy student but see no connection between this woman and the city of Rome is really sleeping in the rum bar! Pardon my frankness but this is too plain for just about the average Joe not to see!

So obvious is the definite application of this prophetic symbol that even the casual reader can pick that up! But there is more to her than just the city of Rome, and I am going to show you where it is included as a definition in one of the most prestigious dictionaries in the world! I was quite amazed at how this definition 'hits the nail on the head' while mainstream preachers are glossing over it and treating it like a taboo subject!

You will see why this is too clear for the average person not to see, and that is not the only instance where a definite application is obvious. And let's face it and be honest with ourselves, last-day prophecies will not be fulfilled by a set of unknown "duppies" from outer space! They will be fulfilled by real people that you and I know!

The purpose of this end time prophecy course is to prepare you for the greatest religious crisis of all time, and to arm you with the requisite knowledge that will ensure you don't end up on the <u>wrong side</u> of the controversy when this prophecy is being fulfilled!

Let it be understood from now!

I'd rather tell you the truth and not have a single copy of this prophecy course downloaded than to have a million copies downloaded on lies.

Not an attempt to indoctrinate

The good thing about this course is you will see that I am not just trying to put across <u>my opinion</u>. I make every effort to ensure all my conclusions are based strictly on BIBLICAL SOLUTIONS (One of the most valuable lessons I learned in my prophecy studies since I came around to this new understanding is this: 'DO NOT LOOK OUTSIDE THE BIBLE FOR YOUR SOLUTIONS TO END-TIME PROPHECIES'. Where logical deductions are necessary, I would draw on empirical evidences in the form of information from secular and religious materials as well as from news clippings. And while this is not an attempt to reinvent the wheel, you will see many things in the course which does not accord with the traditional prophecy positions of various Bible commentators (And there is a reason for this. Most Bible commentators are just there to serve the "status quo", they don't want to rock the boat too much and say anything that will earn them pariah status. You will notice that many theologians in their criticisms of unorthodox views would often say,

"That's not mainstream" simply because they are more interested in defending the majority view instead of what the Bible teaches). Nevertheless, you will see for yourself that much of the conclusions that are arrived at are quite self-evident.






